COURSE MAP



Genera

Members, guests and visitors have responsibility as golfers, caddies or spectators on the course to ensure that they adhere strictly to the following:

- 1.0 Practicing is strictly limited to the designated practice areas of the club, which are: (a) the practice areas on the 18th and 13th holes and (b) the practice greens near to the 1st and 13th tees.
- 1.1 In wet or inclement weather, you should exercise extra care. Steps, mats, paths and slopes may be slippery, particularly in wet or frosty conditions.
- 1.2 You are advised to approach all trees and spinneys on the course with caution, particularly during windy or other adverse weather conditions.
- 1.3 You are advised to use caution when going down or up any steep incline on the course, particularly when using trolleys. It is not advisable to play a shot if any doubt exists as to your wellbeing as a result of playing that shot.
- I.4 You are advised to avoid oral contact with anything that comes into contact with the golf course (including trees, sand, soil and grass).
- 1.5 In the event that you come across any dead wildlife on the course, you should avoid coming into contact with it.
- 1.6 You are advised to exercise caution at all times on the course in respect of identifying areas where you may be at potential risk of being hit by another golfer's ball.
- 1.7 You are advised to exercise caution when playing to avoid hitting anybody with your golf ball.
- 1.8 If you see a shot is heading in the direction of other golfers or members of the public, shout "FORE!" in a loud voice to alert them of possible danger. If "FORE!" is heard when playing, please take evasive action immediately.
- 1.9 Golfers must always stand well back behind the player who is playing his shot, both on the tee and on all other areas of the course. A swinging golf club can be dangerous and can cause serious injury.
- 1.10 You are advised to exercise caution when crossing the small road from the 12th green towards the 13th tee, and from the 14th green to the 15th tee.
- 1.11 It is recommended that golfers are insured against the unlikely event of them being injured or causing injury as a result of an errant shot.
- 1.13 The green staff are regularly working on the course when play is in progress. Please be careful and courteous to them. In the interests of their health, safety and well-being, please ensure they are aware of and have acknowledged your presence prior to playing in their proximities.
- All Members, Guests and Visitors are invited to bring to the attention of the secretary, Steve Barr, any hazards they feel have not been addressed.

Notes

Please take account of the following clauses laid down in the Bye-Laws of the Wimbledon and Putney Commons Act 1871:

- 2.1 No person playing golf shall strike or play any ball near any person walking, riding or driving over the Commons, or otherwise play golf in such a manner as to injure, endanger, alarm or any ony person traversing or being on the Commons for exercise, recreation or other lawful purpose.
- 2.3 No person playing golf shall require any person crossing the Commons between any tee and any green to move away, or otherwise interfere with any such person.
- 2.4 Every person playing golf shall wear a red coat, or other outer red garment.
- 2.5 Every person playing golf must commence from either the first tee on the Wimbledon side or the first tee on the Windmill side and at no other point and must observe the rules in force upon the course.
- 2.6 Every person playing golf shall be a member, whether for the day or for a longer period, of a club recognized for the purpose of this Bye-law by the Conservators and shall comply with the recognized etiquette and rules of the game and with any special rules laid down by the club
